

Accountability in Custody: Law, Mental Health, and Institutional Practice



Leeds Law School's Centre for Justice, Law and Policy invites you to an interdisciplinary seminar, in partnership with LUNG Theatre and the SLSA. Deaths in custody raise critical questions about the state's duty of care and accountability. This seminar explores how law, mental health, and institutional practice shape responses to these deaths.

The event will open in the **School of Arts cinema** with two short films by LUNG Theatre, inspired by *Woodhill*, centring the experiences of families affected by deaths in custody. Followed by, short presentations, and panel discussion, attendees will reflect on legal frameworks, mental health in custodial settings, and institutional practices shaping care and risk.
